

THE HERITAGE EXHIBITION

If you're interested to learn more about the rich history of The E&O Hotel, visit the Exhibition Gallery located at the Victory Annexe Wing. The curator Merlyn, will take you back in time with stories, antiques and relics from the past.

There are beautiful dresses on display, which were worn by singers who entertained the guests. The dresses on display were truly a reminder of the glitz and glamorous days of The E&O Hotel.

There is also a beautiful wedding dress on display which tells the story of the marriage of an American school teacher who met her husband while in Penang. They got married in The E&O, Penang. The original invitation cards are on display, and much like an English style wedding. Afternoon tea of scones and cucumber sandwiches were served to guests. 50 years later, she came back to The E&O to celebrate their golden anniversary. She made her own wedding gown, and the couple are still together today, residing in Kuala Lumpur.

The original elevator from The E&O is still functioning. If you dare to take a ride inform the receptionist and they will take you on this unique experience.





HISTORY

The property began its colourful history in 1884 as The Eastern. The Oriental was added in 1885 due to the Eastern's overwhelming popularity. The Hotels were combined to become the Eastern & Oriental Hotel and was established by the Armenian Sarkies brothers, Martin and Tigran.

Penang drew travellers of every shade and description-merchants, missionaries, mercenaries, sailors and adventurers. Writers, actors, playwrights, the rich and the titled, bored with Europe and America, looked to the exotic East to satisfy their wanderlust.


In 1891, another Sarkies brother, Arshak, joined the business. More flamboyant than his brother, he added a large ballroom in 1903. Before long, the E&O became the centre of the social life and gaiety of Penang and its surroundings. It was the venue for the island's major functions, such as weddings, banquets and the annual St. George's Day Ball. Visiting musicians and cabaret acts also found their way to the E&O. Famous guests who enjoyed its hospitality included Mary Pickford, Douglas Fairbanks, Noel Coward, Rudyard Kipling, Charlie Chaplin, Somerset Maugham and Hermann Hesse.

Today, more than a century since its establishment, the E&O has reclaimed its heritage. And with its return to elegance, it would not be a matter of wonder, as a writer once pointed out, 'those who have once visited the famous hotel, regard the E&O as a haven to be sought again and again, as the traveller returns to the home of his affection.'















The Heritage Wing features all-suites, evoking an aura of place and time, maintaining strong historical links and traditions yet coupled with the facilities of the present day. All suites are magnificently furnished, extravagantly spacious and come in eight different types, with either city of sea views. Each suite comes with modern day amenities and every guest who stays at the E&O Hotel receives individual attention. The hotel's round-the-clock impeccable butler service guarantees that guest's personal needs and comfort are the focus from the moment they arrive. Set amidst a beautifully manicured garden is their swimming pool that faces the sea and is the focal point for guests seeking to unwind. There is also the oldest 'Java Tree,' which was planted before 1885, which still stands.

Staying true to its architectural inspiration, E&O unveiled its new extension in March 2013 - a 15-storey building named the Victory Annexe. The Annexe adds a further 122 classically appointed, sea-fronting suites, complemented by new restaurants, meeting rooms, pool, spa, and niche retail outlets.

The same architectural elements of the original hotel are incorporated into the Victory Annexe. In keeping with the original colonial styled guestrooms of the early 1900s, all suites feature Victorian details such as en-suite bathrooms fitted with claw footed long baths, pedestal ceramic basins, lazy ceiling fans and breezy private balconies.



Guests staying at the Victory Annexe enjoy exclusive privileges such as complimentary non-alcoholic beverages from the mini bar. Also included in the room rate are daily continental breakfast and complimentary coffee and tea throughout the day as well as evening cocktails with canapés at The Planters Lounge from 6pm to 7pm daily. Privacy is assured and only guests staying at the Victory Annexe are allowed access to The Planters Lounge. Timeless elegance is coupled with modern conveniences such as a fully-equipped gym and swimming pool.
